Georgia Youth Choir Festival



Over 100 youth and adults from 8 churches participated in the First Annual Georgia Youth Choir Festival sponsored by CBF of Georgia and the McAfee-Townsend Institute of Mercer University over MLK Jr. Weekend, January 12-14, 2007. This pilot event was held at the Calvin Center in Hampton, Ga., and included periods of extended rehearsals, as well as times for fellowship. On Sunday, the mass choir led worship at FBC Griffin in the morning service and gave concerts Sunday afternoon/evening at Kings Bridge Retirement Community and Briarcliff Baptist Church, Atlanta. John Simons, director of the McAfee-Townsend Institute, was the primary conductor for the weekend, with four other ministers of music directing one piece each. This event gives church youth choirs the opportunity to sing a wide variety of musical genres, to experience differing conducting styles and techniques, and to strengthen relationships with other CBF/GA churches.

Fellowship to offer Spiritual Formation Retreats over next two years

ATLANTA – The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Spiritual Formation Network will offer four retreats in the next two years, including retreats for associate pastors.

For the first time the network will host three regional spiritual formation retreats for associate ministers of children, youth, education, faith formation, spiritual formation and associate pastors and chaplains. A fourth retreat is scheduled for pastors.

“While pastors are ultimately responsible for the spiritual formation of their congregation, it is often associates who are charged with the tasks of congregational spiritual formation, especially that of youth and children,” said Rick Bennett, the Fellowship’s associate coordinator for congregational life.

Like the network’s previous pastors’ retreats, the retreats for associates will focus on Sabbath. Led by Bo Prosser, the Fellowship’s coordinator for congregational life, and Bennett, participants will experience Sabbath through silence, solitude, study, reflection, worship, and fellowship.

ATLANTA – An event celebrating Baptist history will be held Aug. 1-3 at First Baptist Church of Charleston, S.C.

Leaders from 20 Baptist groups have been involved in planning the event for the past five years. The meeting will commemorate the 300th anniversary of the oldest continuing Baptist association in America – the Philadelphia Baptist Association.

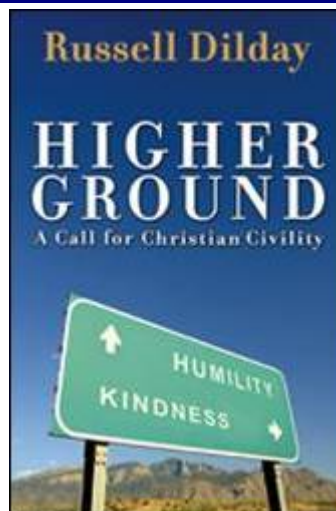
Speakers will include Cooperative Baptist Fellowship moderator Emmanuel McCall, who will lead a discussion on Baptists and the Civil Rights movement.

“Baptists have an interesting history,” said McCall. “The Lord has done great things with us through cooperating, rather than through forced, judicatory structure. The Charleston event helps us to see how God has used us, sometimes in spite of ourselves. We will celebrate where God has brought us from, and look forward excitedly to

what God will do.”
