Dear Baptist Clergy:

Global poverty produces chronic hunger, ill health, high child mortality, gender inequality, unsafe drinking water, and the lack of educational opportunities. In turn, these maladies breed even more poverty, marring the image of God in an unfathomable number of human beings and keeping them from experiencing the goodness of God's creation.

Global poverty doesn't result from silence in American pulpits on this issue. Congregants hear their preachers address the issue. In fact, a July 2006 Pew Research Center survey found that 92

Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond School of Christian Ministry offers Online Course: Technology in Ministry

RICHMOND – The School of Christian Ministry at BTSR offers the 4-week online course Oct. 2-29, 2006. *Technology in Ministry* will examine options for using Web technology for congregational education and discipleship. Participants will 1) learn what resources are available that their congregation can use even if the church doesn't have a web site, technologically oriented staff, or lots of money to spend; 2) explore and analyze available Web-based learning options and discuss their application to various congregational settings; 3) examine pre-packaged and "build your own" resources; and 4) discuss topics such as content, cost, format, interactivity, and adaptability.

The online course materials and discussion forums are Internet-based and accessible anytime, from anywhere. Participants engage in thought-provoking Q&A and discussion with class members and the instructor via threaded discussion forums. Nov. 4-5 CBF/GA Fall Convocation First Baptist Church, Savannah University Baptist Church, Hattiesburg, and CBF/MS have been working to help get the folks of Pearlington, MS, back into homes since Katrina all but wiped out this small community. We have helped with the reconstruction of many homes, have finished one, and have several others under construction. We desperately need volunteer teams who can spend at least a week in Pearlington so we can get these folks back into homes before winter.

Accommodations - we have two large air conditioned rooms - with cots which will accommodate about thirty people each. There are also six air conditioned sea-huts, with cots which will accommodate about sixteen people each. There are showers nearby, laundry facilities, eating facilities, and portable toilets. Volunteers would need to bring their own pillows, sheets, towels, and tools for building if possible. The more help we get, the sooner we can get these folks back into homes. 
