Young Leaders' Program

The Young Leaders' Program is designed to help prepare the next generation of ministry leaders. This effort is intended to strengthen congregational and denominational leaders in their twenties or thirties who have ministry experience, but who have not yet reached mid-life and mid-career. The Young Leaders' Program is a year-long leadership effectiveness process involving 65-70 hours of intensive training over four levels. Three self-development projects

extend the growth process beyond the actual training sessions and provide motivation for the integration of the training into the participant's ministry setting.

There are significant differences in how ministerial leadership is understood and practiced among churches. This learning event will explore some of the deeper dimensions of those differences by examining pastoral leadership in three dimensions: *the paradigm of the leader; the purposes of the leader; and the person of the leader.*

This theological conversation on ministerial leadership will seek to help ministers develop and practice the kind of leadership that fosters "ministerial excellence." The resource persons for this event are William E. Hull and David Hull. William Hull is Research Professor at Samford University where he previously served as Provost (1987-96), and University Professor (1987-2000). For more than two decades he served on the faculty and administration of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. David Hull serves as Pastor of First Baptist Church, Huntsville, AL. He has had a distinguished career as a pastor serving congregations in Kentucky, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Alabama.

The event will begin on Monday, October 2, 2006, at 1:00 p.m. at First Baptist Church, Knoxville, TN. It will end on Tuesday, October 3, at 12:00 p.m. The format for the event will include large group presentations and small group discussion times with peers and the discussion leaders. Reduced rates for overnight accommodations are available at Hampton Inn & Suites at 618 W. Main Street (in walking distance of the church) for \$109.00 per night (includes covered parking and breakfast). The evening meal on Monday night will be provided for participants. The registration fee for this event is \$25.00 per person. Registration deadline is Sept.1.

Considering a Doctor of Ministry Degree Program?

One of the greatest challenges we have as ministers is that of keeping up with trends and innovations in ministry. It's a full-time job bringing creative approaches to our work. Of course, we can read books, talk to colleagues, and read journals...but sometimes we need a cohort of folks around us who are struggling with the same issues to ignite our creative juices. This is what the Doctor of Ministry (D. Min.) degree program can do. It can ignite new directions for ministry.

Maybe you have been out of ministry for a decade or longer, or perhaps you are just getting started. In any case, the challenge of the D. Min. can provide any minister the opportunity to enhance skills. The Doctor of Ministry degree at McAfee is uniquely suited to engage students with cutting edge research that can challenge and provide new directions for ministry. The program is unique because it allows the student to custom design his or her study interests around topics of concern. The program requires three major seminars of three weeks each on campus over a three year period— one seminar a year. An off-campus, independent study program is also interwoven between the seminars and provides for specific research into the area of concentration that is of the most interest to the student.

The D. Min. student has the benefit of studying with professors who are engaged with the latest research,

with a field supervisor who has experience in the student's chosen field and serves as a mentor, and with student colleagues who form a cohort of study partners for the duration of the program. The program is unique in that it challenges the student to do original research in a chosen field of study. The final project thesis seeks to provide the student's ministry with new directions and new approaches that will enhance any ministry. The student's project thesis is focused so that it is of such quality that it can be published, thus helping others benefit from the research.
